You can put injectables *where?*

Now anyone can get Vanessa Williams' flawless look — without going under the knife!

Say bye-bye to bags and hello to fuller cheeks

A face-lift without the scalpel? NYC oculoplastic surgeon Dr. Joseph Eviatar says the filler Radiesse (which costs \$1,200 and lasts up to five years) can be injected into the upper cheeks to help contour them and reduce the appearance of under-eye bags. (It can also be used in lieu of an implant to shape a chin!)



Shape a nose without surgery

"Fillers [like Radiesse] are now being used to correct small nasal deformities," says Beverly Hills cosmetic surgeon Dr. Fardad Forouzanpour, who adds that a dab of Botox (up to \$400) can "paralyze the tip of the nose to keep it from dropping."

Get a perfect pout in a pinch

Patients have been puckering up to Juvéderm filler, at about \$850 a pop, to plump thin lips. But a gummy smile can be corrected too — Botox relaxes the upper-lip muscle, preventing it from contracting and exposing the gum line, says Dr. Forouzanpour of the up-to-\$500 process for this area.



Bigger boobs with a needle?

In Europe, the new filler Macrolane is being used to boost assets a full cup size. But the procedure (about \$3,000) could have drawbacks, says Florida plastic surgeon Dr. Michael Salzhauer: "There's a risk of breasts looking somewhat lumpier than implants would look."

Make walking in stilettos a cinch

"[Two to three treatments of] podiatric dermal filler can restore and replace lost padding, resulting in less pain when exercising, walking and wearing stilettos," Camille Meyer of NYC's Tribeca MedSpa says about this \$2,000 solution.



Fillers can easily lift brows

"You can inject Juvéderm under the eyebrows to create a nonsurgical brow lift," says New York facial plastic surgeon Dr. Andrew Jacono. "When you fill up the area underneath, the brows lift up, becoming more arched and feminine."

Even earlobes can be rejuvenated

Give earrings a fresh canvas by elevating saggy lobes. Dr. Salzhauer says a 15-minute, \$1,200 procedure in which Radiesse or Juvéderm is injected into the earlobes can reduce wrinkling and make lobes fuller and more youthful.

Botox smooths a neck...

Vanessa Williams swears by Botox injections for a wrinkle-free face — but now docs are using the drug for more than fine facial lines. New Jersey plastic surgeon Dr. Brian S. Glatt offers an up-to-\$700 procedure using Botox to smooth unwanted bands in the neck area.

...and prevents a sticky situation

To curb excessive sweating, you can inject Botox under arms and into the palms of hands, says California plastic surgeon Dr. Richard Chaffoo about the procedure that costs up to \$2,000 and lasts four to six months.

Turn back time on aging hands

"As the natural aging process occurs, skin loses its elasticity and deteriorates," says Dr. Forouzanpour, who adds that Radiesse, which costs up to \$1,800 per area and lasts a year, can fill out the skin. Hands look dramatically younger — with no downtime.
