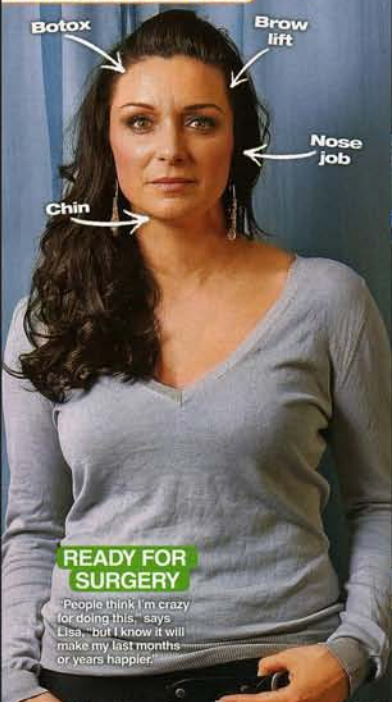

imitation may be the sincerest form of flattery, but Lisa Connell may be taking things a little too far. After being diagnosed with an inoperable brain tumor in 2006, Lisa's last wish is to have a complete makeover to look like her idol, Demi Moore. "Plans have been made to make my dream come true," the 29-year-old from London tells *In Touch*. "I want to be happy with myself both inside and out. Demi is very beautiful, and people have pointed out the similarities in our stature and coloring."

This month, Lisa will undergo liposuction, a breast enhancement, a butt lift, an eyebrow lift, dental work and microdermabrasion. Lisa's mother, Angela Bowler, 49, planned to use the money she had saved for her daughter's wedding to pay for the work, but Skin Health Spa recently offered to perform Lisa's surgeries, which will cost about \$60,000, free of charge. "All I want is for my daughter to be happy," says Angela, who will now use her savings to move closer to Lisa and take care of her during her recovery. "I'll be extremely

anxious when she's having the treatments, but she's wanted this for as long as I can remember."

The surgeries are risky

At 27, after having a miscarriage, Lisa began experiencing severe headaches and troubles with her vision, hearing, balance and memory, which led to her diagnosis. Depressed, she attempted suicide twice before getting her life back on track.

When Demi heard Lisa's story, she wrote on twitter.com, "Wish I could contact this woman who wants to have surgery to look like me and encourage her not to!" But Lisa won't change her mind. "I say a big thank you to Demi for caring," she says. "Her words are wise, but I have to find what makes me happy."

Plastic surgeon **Dr. Brian Glatt**, who does not treat Lisa, tells *In Touch* that the makeover could be dangerous. "I would never perform all these surgeries at once," he says. "They should be spaced out carefully." Despite warnings, Lisa is looking forward to her transformation, explaining, "My goal is to simply look the best I can. I want to die beautiful."
